### A Review of Accomplishments in 2023



What a joy to celebrate and recap a year of Women In Trucking as we review 2023.

This is especially meaningful to me as I complete my first year as President & CEO. This is a special community and it's a privilege to be amongst all of you who strive to achieve the WIT mission day in and day out.

We continue to have a thriving membership, building on the growth year-over-year, now with a membership of over 8,000 individuals and companies. Our dedicated members showcase the mission, vision and values of the association and the trucking profession – allowing us to bring more individuals on our journey each year.

We hope you'll read this report to not only review and celebrate this past year with us, but also to encourage others to read it and join us to advance opportunities for women throughout transportation, eliminate obstacles and celebrate the many successes.

#### 2023 Highlights:

We hosted our two signature events, Salute to Women Behind the Wheel and Accelerate! Conference & Expo – both tremendous opportunities to gather, celebrate, and learn with and from our community.

Salute to Women Behind the Wheel is our annual celebration of female drivers. During Salute, we had the honor of giving away a truck to Angelique Temple of Tornado Transport LLC and honoring Mary "Candy" Bass as 2023 Driver of the Year. With six million safe miles, Candy's dedication to safety and the growth of female drivers makes her a legend in this profession. Our *WITney*<sup>®</sup> Educational Trailer traveled the road more in 2023 than in any year previously. *WITney*<sup>®</sup>, along with our dedicated volunteers who staff and transport her, allow us to meet with young students, Girl Scouts, community groups, college students and many more to educate them on the possibilities available with a career in the trucking industry, and of course to try their skills on the popular driver simulator.

We hosted 12 webinars in 2023, celebrating our mission and connecting a community of information sharing through topics such as advice for women pursuing a professional driving career, health and wellness practices, how to avoid cyber risks, use of mobile technology on the road, and advice on how women can effectively navigate career opportunities in transportation.

Our WIT Index was released in May 2023. The industry barometer for careers in transportation, the index had more than 300 company participants sharing data on topics such as number of female CDL holders, women serving in the C-suite, growth of careers in operations and technicians, along with commitment to gender diversity within their companies.

We honored more than 100 leaders in transportation throughout the year through several programs, including: Top Women to Watch in Transportation; Member of the Month Program; Top Woman-Owned Businesses in Transportation; the Influential Woman in Trucking; the Distinguished Woman in Logistics; Driver of the Year; and Top Companies for Women to Work For in Transportation.

And, finally, we honored and celebrated the retirement of two of the association's foundational leaders since its inception in 2007, Membership Director Char Pingel and Founder Ellen Voie. The grit and vision of these two friends and champions toward creating a better world for women in trucking are a key reason for the growth and opportunities that exist today for this organization, and women across the industry.

#### **2023 ACHIEVEMENTS AND PROGRAMS**



### **Encouraging Employment of Women**

- The 2023 Accelerate! Conference & Expo attracted 1,700 professionals who experienced the power of networking, learning, best practices and collaboration of this unique conference.
- Hundreds of professional drivers and executives in trucking attended the Salute to Women Behind the Wheel to celebrate female drivers at the Mid-America Trucking Show in March 2023 in Louisville, Ky.
- The 2023 WIT Index shows percentages of women in these key roles in transportation: C-Suite Executives (31.6%), Company Leaders (36.9%), Boards of Directors (28.4%), HR/Talent Management (74.6%), Technician roles (7.5%), Professional Truck Drivers with CDLs (12.1%), Dispatchers (43.5%), and Safety roles (41.6%).
- We managed a Professional Driver Hub that provides invaluable resources to female drivers, including the ability to

- More than 2,300 individuals registered to participate in the 2023 WIT Webinars Program on a wide range of topics including advice for women pursuing a professional driving career, health and wellness practices, how to avoid cyber risks, use of mobile technology on the road, and how women can effectively navigate career opportunities in transportation.
- There were more than 3,800 interactions and conversations via the WIT Engage digital platform that helped to build the Women In Trucking community.
- Our member communications, *Redefining the Road* and *WIT eNews* covered such critical topics as exploring the many career paths in trucking, building a business case for diversity, addressing the shortage in truck parking, mentoring, best practices in employee resource groups, understanding unconscious bias, encouraging male allyship, recruiting younger talent into trucking careers, electric vehicles, human trafficking and its imprint on our society, driver health and fitness, and many HERstories.
